Restorative Practices & Circles

Restorative Practices is a philosophy that focuses on building positive relationships and providing opportunities for students to take responsibility for their behavior while remaining connected to the school and community. This philosophy can be used for disciplinary responses and research shows it to be an effective tool at times when discipline is needed. It is another tool that educators can use for classroom management and student accountability.

The course teaches the different types of Restorative Circles and the situations in which they are best utilized; the elements necessary to conduct a Restorative Circles session; and how to conduct a Restorative Circle session.

Conflict Resolution

Participants learn a framework for understanding how crisis occurs and steps and strategies useful to prevent and intervene challenging student behavior. We discuss areas such as Self Awareness, Understanding Dynamics that impact behavior, how the environment affects the situation, and effective response. Participants will also explore the concepts within active listening and effective behavior management techniques.

De-Escalation Skills

This course uses techniques from **Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI)**. Participants learn to recognize the stages of crisis to better understand how to respond and practical skills to safely defuse crisis situations involving students to adults.

ICS 100 Incident Command Systems

This training promotes effective response by familiarizing participants with how **Incident Command System (ICS)** principles are used to manage incidents. The course prepares participants to coordinate with response partners from all levels of government and the private sector.

ICS-100.b follows the National Incident Management System (NIMS) guidelines. Course led by Certified Instructor.

ICS 200 Incident Command Systems (This is offered after completion of ICS 100)

ICS-200 is designed to enable participants to operate efficiently during an incident or event within the Incident Command System (ICS). This course focuses on the management of single resources.

Course led by Certified Instructor.



CRISIS INTERVENTION

Master the art of crisis prevention with our comprehensive training rooted in **proven Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) principles**. This course equips participants with evidence-based strategies to safely de-escalate volatile situations and effectively manage challenging behaviors before they escalate into full crisis mode. You'll develop critical skills for responding to both reactive and aggressive students while learning how non-verbal communication can make or break tense situations.

Beyond immediate intervention, participants gain a structured framework for teaching **vital coping skills** during the crucial post-crisis period, creating lasting positive change and building resilience in the students you serve.

1-3 full-day sessions (based on needs assessment). Sessions are 6 hours/day.

Up to 25 staff per session.

Annual training update is recommended.

Course taught by a previously certified instructor.

Participants who attend all three days will be tested on comprehension and will receive a certificate.

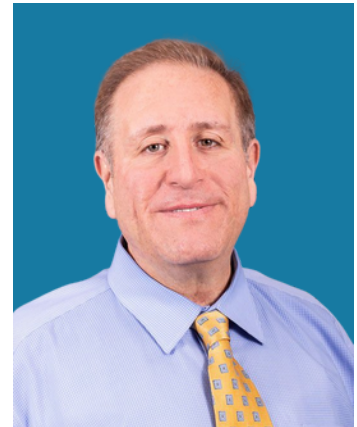
